

Top Tips for Talk



Tip Number 1

Get down to your child's level as much as possible

When you want your child to really pay attention to what you are saying, try to kneel down to their level so that they can see your face clearly. This will help to gain their attention and encourage them to listen to what you are saying.



Reception Preview Learning

Next week we will be focusing our learning around Fireworks and the Hindu festival of Diwali.



We will be writing firework words, using paint to make pictures and doing a firework dance in PE. You can help by talking with your child about fireworks, describing their patterns and their sounds.



Children are grouped according to their ability for their sound learning. This ensures that they are learning at the right pace. When children are ready, they will be bringing home phonic reading books. Please encourage the children to use their sound knowledge to work out the simple words in the books and practice Fred Talk.

Maths Learning

We have another number week next week. We will be concentrating on taking away to subtract and 'find out how many are left'? You can help by asking your child to help you count items on a table and then put some away and find out how many are left.
